

Flight From Prague - Michael Lewis Book Launch

The Old Edwardians' Association and the School came up trumps for the launch of "Flight from Prague - the Making of a Refugee", the family story of how my father found refuge in the UK in 1939.

My thanks go to John Parr and Peter Kersh who generously championed the launch and to Linda Gooden and Jo Jackson at the School who made the event happen.

None of us anticipated that 220 people would be in the Hall on Friday 19 September for an emotionally charged event. OEs, former colleagues and present staff at the School, some of my former students going back to the 1970s, friends from far afield as well as from Sheffield, came together to welcome the book with warmth and enthusiasm.

Questions from the audience ranged widely, including about the history of the period and the contemporary relevance of a story about refugees and how we talk about them.

OBITUARIES

John Haworth 1960-67

It is with heavy heart that I report the passing of Jonathan Mayo Haworth on September 28th 2025, just a few days before his 77th birthday.

John studied law at King's College London and went on to have a highly successful career as a barrister, recorder and, for almost two decades, judge at Cambridge Crown Court. He was also my best friend of 64 years.

The funeral took place at Cam Valley Crematorium, Great Chesterford on Friday 24th October.

David Plews 1965-72

We are very sad to report the death of Dave Plews in September. Dave was a teacher, passionate about coaching children with SEMH difficulties. He played rugby still and refereed into his 70th year and raised significant amounts of money for charitable causes through triathlon events.

Dave was diagnosed with terminal cancer earlier this year. He was extremely keen to come to the dinner once again next year and, fittingly, was the first to reserve his place!

Mike Ogglesby 1950-58

Mike Ogglesby died in Bristol on 15th September 2025 from complications following major surgery, following three falls and two broken legs. He was 86.

Mike did National Service having left Sheffield University and went on to serve over 30 years in the Royal Artillery and the Intelligence Corps. He served around the world in the Far East, Central America, Europe and Northern Ireland, retiring as a Major. He then became the Deputy Director of Security at Aldermaston before retiring to Salisbury and latterly Bristol.

Mike is survived by Deanna, his wife of 64 years, his son James, and grandson.

Martin (MTJ) Axford 1964-70 English teacher, St John's Cambridge, died aged 91

Steve Harrison 1959-66 Prefect and captain of rugby. Steve was one of the foremost health policy scholars of his generation and an accomplished folk musician. He died 27th July 2018 aged 71.

Anthony (Tony) Haws 1957-65(??) Tony died in 2024 aged 77. He went on to Wadham College, Oxford to study Maths and a PhD in Operational Research at the University of Birmingham in 1971. He will be especially remembered for his pivotal role in the merger of the Institute of Statisticians and the Royal Statistical Society in 1993. Alongside his successful career as a statistician Tony served as a church minister in County Durham and Ealing before retiring in 2013.
